
Lakkari Pitt is a proud Gamilaroi Ularoi/Yuwaalaraay woman from Walgett, New South Wales.



Staff contributed to the artwork by adding a symbol which either represented them or signified their strengths when working within their community.


The artwork is titled Goondi, meaning house or home in Gamilaroi language.


Lakkari was commissioned to design the 2019 Dreamtime Awards program.

The National Dreamtime Awards is an opportunity for First Nations people from across our country to come together and recognise their excellence in the categories of Sport, Arts, Education, Health and Community.

The awards are attended by the country's most high profile political and community figures, sporting stars, entertainers and personalities.

This was the first time the Dreamtime Awards had commissioned an artist to design their program.





Homeland Calling is a collection of poems created from hip-hop song lyrics that channel culture and challenge stereotypes. Written by First Nations youth from communities all around Australia. Homeland Calling is edited by award-winning author and poet Ellen van Neerven, and brought to you by Desert Pea Media.

Lakkari was commissioned to illustrate the cover and internal pages for Homeland Calling.







The Lakkari Art x Teacherlatte collections were created with meaning and purpose, to celebrate strength and Aboriginal culture.

The stamp collection was created to empower Aboriginal children to embrace their culture and identity and to feel proud. Each lanyard celebrates Country, Waterways, Sky and the connection we share with each other.

Both lanyards and stamps respectfully invite teachers and students of all nationalities and ethnicities to learn about the rich and dynamic use of Aboriginal symbols and culture. The collections are also about supporting First Nation community-led organisations working with Aboriginal young people, through the Lakkari Art x Teacherlatte Community Fund.



The GO Foundation aims to empower young Indigenous Australians through education and opportunity. It was founded by two proud Indigenous men and AFL greats Adam Goodes and Michael O'Loughlin.

Lakkari had the honour of donating a hand painted Sherrin for their 2020 BIG CATCH UP event.



2Rog Consulting in collaboration with the University of New England engaged Lakkari to provide an artistic and cultural portrayal of the six indicators studied under the Gwydir FLOW-MER Program, a Commonwealth Environmental Water Office initiative.
