


Lakkari Pitt is a proud Gamilaroi Yuwaalaraay woman from Walgett, New South Wales.



Lakkari attended the Aboriginal Housing Office's staff forum as the Artist in Residence.

The collaborative piece showcases AHO and it's three regions - Western, Northern and Sydney South and Eastern (represented by the three circles around the boarder).



Staff contributed to the artwork by adding a symbol which either represented them or signified their strengths when working within their community.

The artwork is titled Goondi, meaning house or home in Gamilaroi language.

The National Dreamtime Awards is an opportunity for First Nation people from across our country to come together and recognise their excellence in the categories of Sport, Arts, Education, Health and Community.
